

What's a neighbourhood plan?

It's a way for a village or community to plan its future development over the next 20 years (up to 2036). It's mainly about planning – for instance, where new houses, shops or offices should be built, of what type, what they should look like and what infrastructure is needed.

Why do a neighbourhood plan in Broomfield?

Chelmsford City Council is currently planning where new development should go across the whole of the area and this is likely to include some in Broomfield. A neighbourhood plan can't stop development, but it gives local people more say. This is our chance to work with the City Council to make sure we have a say in how our village develops, rather than leaving it entirely to developers and the planners.

Can I get help filling in the guestionnaire?

We can't tell you what you should say, but if you need help in reading or understanding it, please let the Steering Group know, by e-mail broomfieldnp@btinternet.com or via the Parish Office on 01245 441660.

Do I have to answer every question?

No. If there are any questions you don't want to complete, just leave those blank.

What if the people in my house have different views?

We have distributed a questionnaire to every household, but if you prefer to fill in a form as separate individuals, you can get an extra form(s) - e-mail broomfieldnp@btinternet.com or ask the Parish Office on 01245 441660. You can also complete it on-line at www.broomfieldessex.co.uk/np

How do I return the questionnaire?

Please return it direct to IDA, the independent data analysis company who will process all the returns for us, using the freepost envelope. If you'd like to save us some postage, you can hand in the sealed envelope to the Parish Office – they will not be opened, just sent in one package to IDA at the end.

Will my views count?

Yes – all the responses will be carefully analysed and used to help develop the plan. The plan will be guided by national planning rules and must be broadly in line with Chelmsford's Local Plan. It also has to be viable – so an Olympic size swimming pool in Broomfield is unlikely, even if everyone wants one! But, as far as possible, the local community decides what should be in the plan – so this is your chance to have a say.

Where can I get more information?

Do I have to give my name and address?

No, just your postcode, unless you choose to give us more information. This consultation is conducted in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998. Responses will be analysed on an anonymous basis and no individual responses will be passed on to other organisations. It will not be possible to identify anyone's individual responses in the analysis.

What happens next?

Once responses have been analysed and considered, we will start to draft the neighbourhood plan. There will be more consultation as the plan develops and then the final version will be examined by an independent inspector, before being put to a local referendum.


