
Landscape and Countryside

The Neighbourhood Plan is a 'landscape-led' Plan. That's because so much of it is about conserving and enhancing the countryside around the village. If the Plan is passed, these are the main things that any new planning applications will need to take account of:

- Keeping the Gap between Broomfield village and the Chelmsford urban area.


The 'Felsted Field Gap' (opposite Roselawn Fields) will become a strategic buffer to stop the urban area expanding northwards to coalesce with the village.

Valued Landscapes

Two large areas of countryside have been assessed as being 'Valued Landscape'. This means they're judged to have a combination of important characteristics that makes them very special.



Future development would be very unlikely. Read the professional assessment.


- Local Green Spaces

15 pieces of land will be designated as 'Local Green Space' meaning they will be treated like Green Belt, so future development would be highly unlikely.

- Landscape Assessment

Based on professional assessment, all the countryside in the Parish has been divided into 8 'local character areas', A to H. These areas have all been professionally assessed to outline their special characteristics and sensitivities. Most of these areas are judged to have little or no capacity for residential or commercial development.




Map 3 - Broomfield Neighbourhood Plan Landscape Appraisal Character Areas
